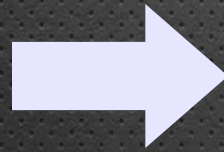
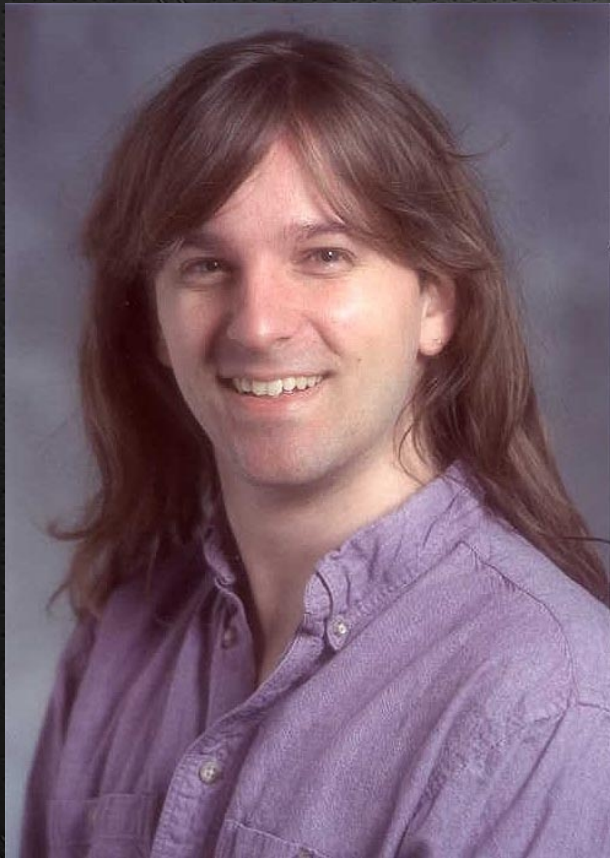

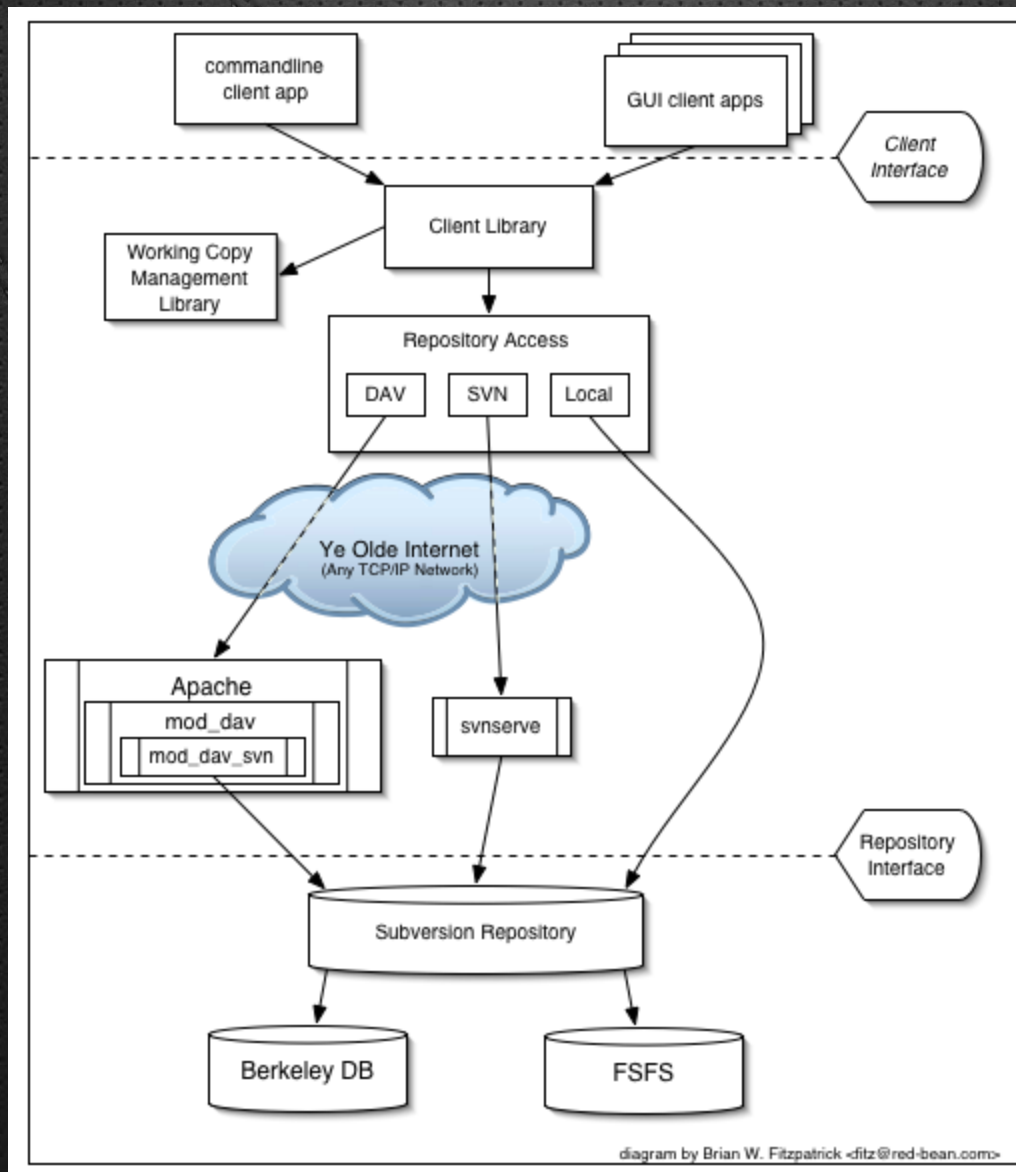

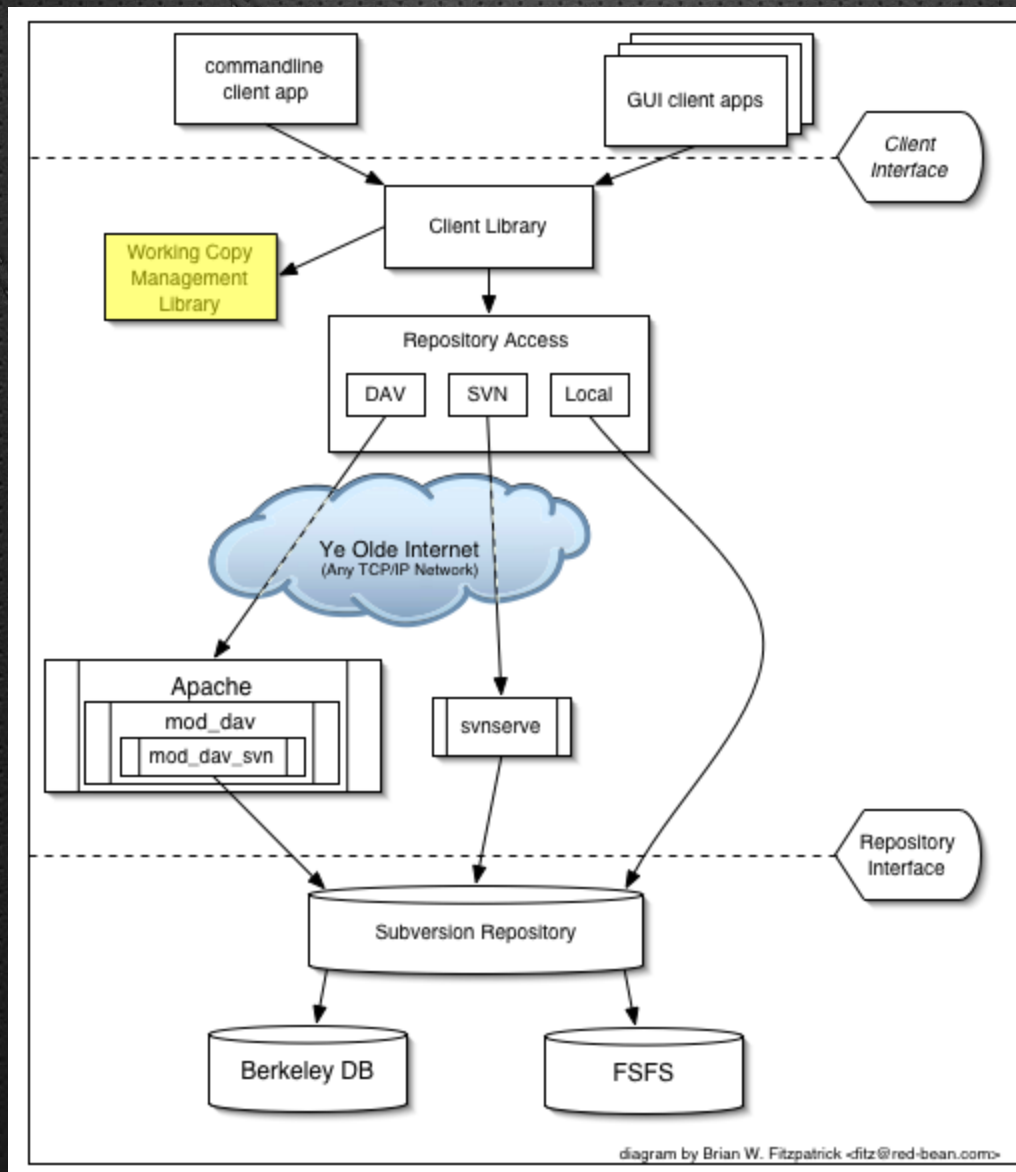

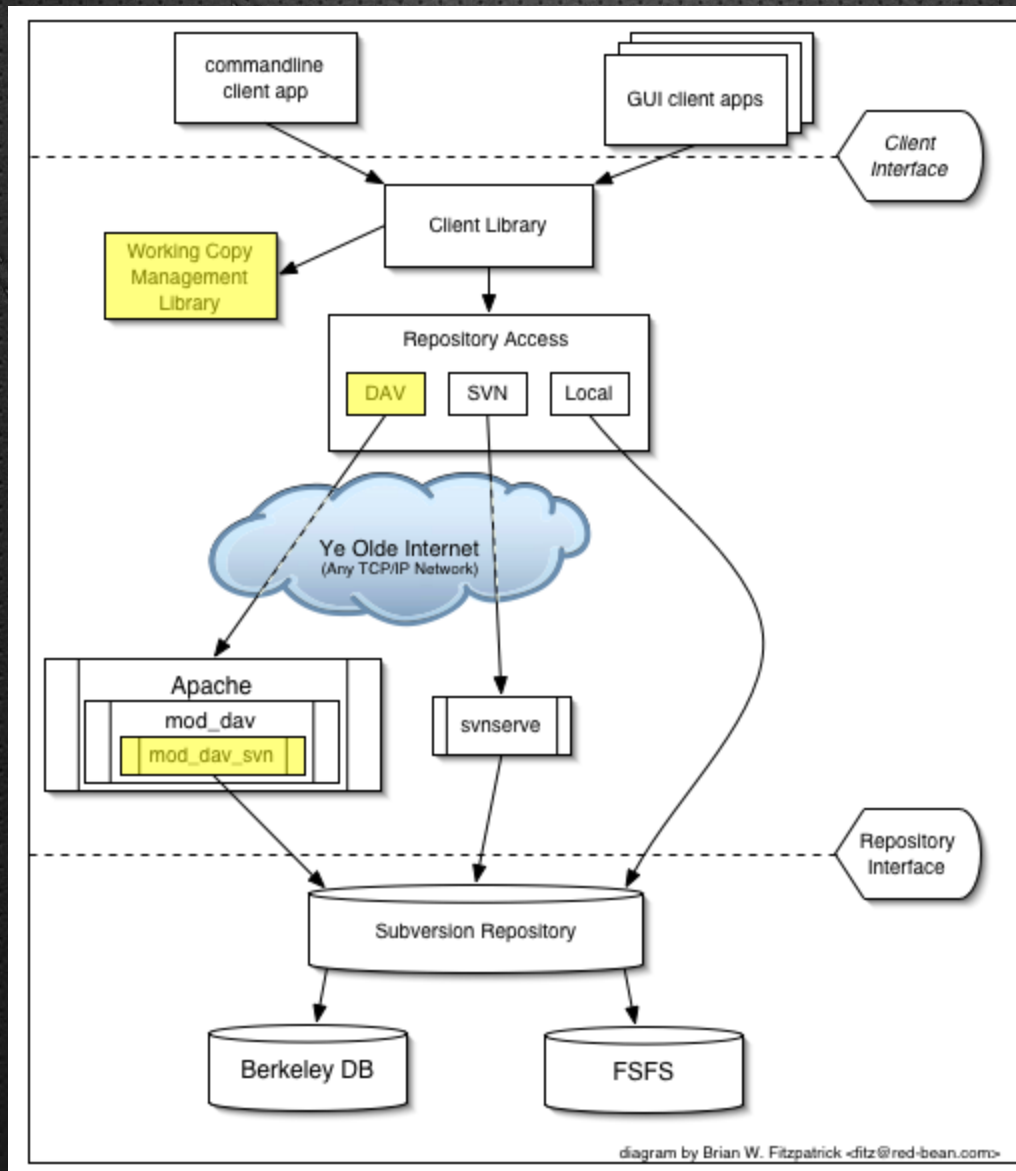
Subversion's modular design





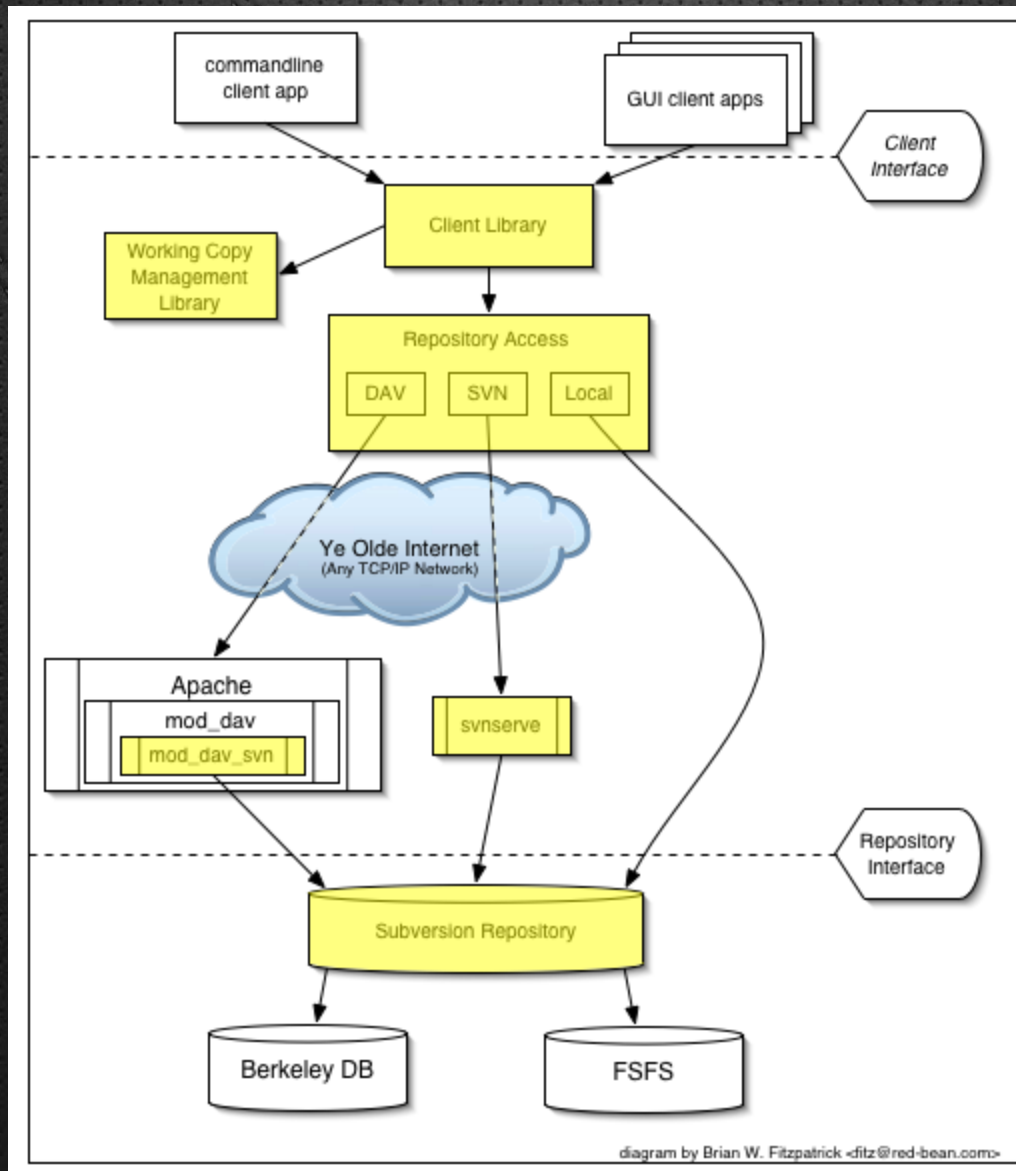
Subversion 1.7: WC-NG





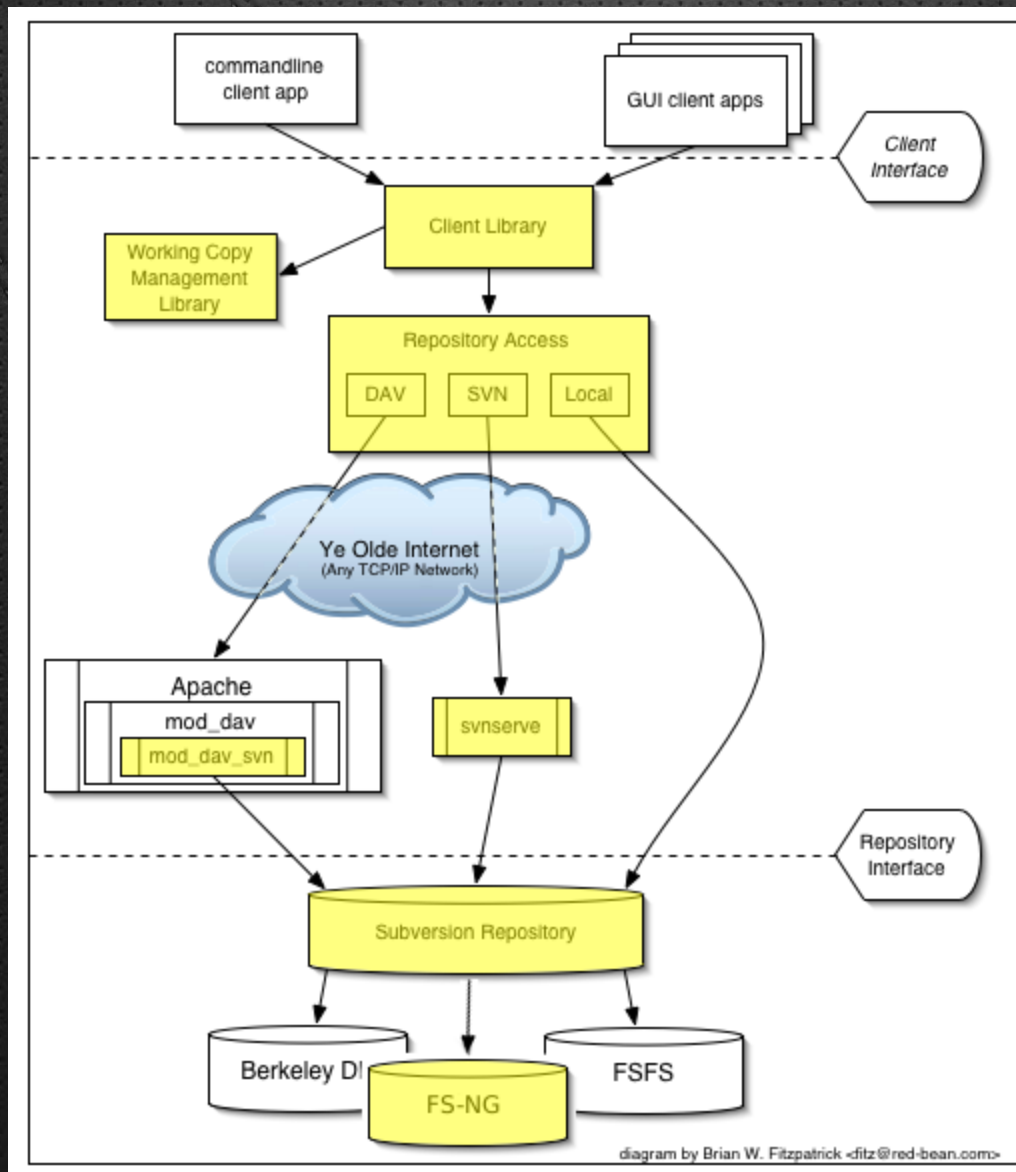
Subversion 1.7: WC-NG + HTTPv2

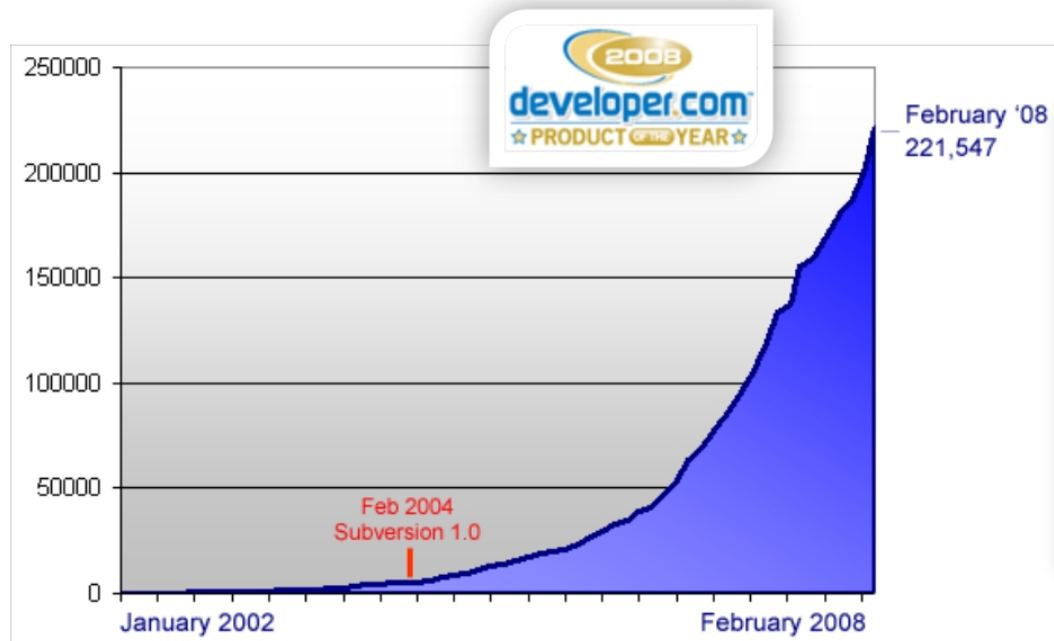

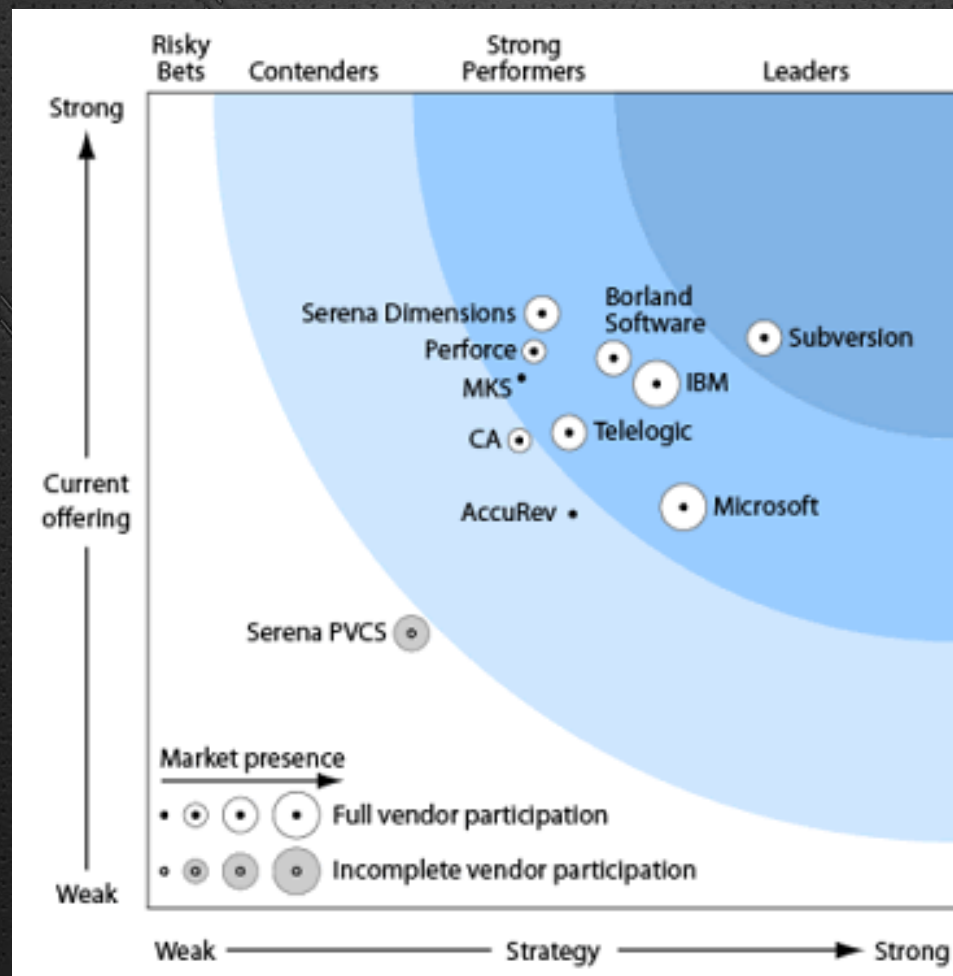
